Join clinician and USEF 'S' judge, Alison Head, for an educational day of test riding with special focus on the new 2019 tests. Riders will be scored on their test of choice followed by a mini-lesson and an opportunity to re-ride the test. Ride sessions are ~30 minutes each, and riders will receive their scored tests. Discussions will cover the pyramid of training, movements and accuracy, common problem areas, how to benefit from collective marks, and more. Auditor seating is plentiful and audience participation is encouraged.

Alison Head has earned her USDF bronze, silver, and gold medals and bronze and silver freestyle bars. She has trained multiple horses to the Grand Prix level, and trained multiple students to compete into the FEI levels. She has a 5-star rating on centerlinescores.com.
