PHILIPPE KARL'S ECOLE DE LÉGÈRETÉ COMING IN APRIL TO MERCERSBURG, PA

About a decade ago, Philippe Karl began his Ecole de Légèreté (EDL) in Europe. There are now more than 16 courses running all over Europe and Australia and Canada. Now, the first course in the USA is about to be in Mercersburg, PA, with Philippe's top student, Bertrand Ravoux, as the lead trainer. With such a unique educational opportunity so close, I hope many IEO members will take advantage of this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. If you have never heard of Philippe Karl, he is a classical riding master, educated at Saumur. He has written 3 books available in English; “The Twisted Truths of Modern Dressage”, “The Art of Riding: Classical Dressage to High School: Odin at Saumur”, and “Long Reining, The Saumur Method”. Nine DVDs of his work and the work of his EDL students and graduates are available (I happen to own all of them if you want to view them I'd be happy to arrange a viewing for the IEO). He is an ardent advocate for training the horse in an ethical, logical, systematic way that is consistent with the

horse's nature. He has worked with Gerd Heuschmann, German veterinarian, and author of "Tug of War", to educate the public on why modern dressage training methods are hurting horses. His books, DVDs, and Teachers Courses serve to show how to train any horse, not just expensive or talented horses, to the highest levels (piaffer, passage, flying changes), while working in ease and lightness.

Those who ride in and audit the course find it much more like attending a University course than a dressage clinic. Eight riders have been selected by Philippe Karl and over the course of three years they will train their horses thru advanced level work in dressage, jumping, and in-hand work. The course consists of three 4-day clinics per year with a 10th clinic in the 4th year where riders take their exams. Riders are tested on their evaluation and teaching skills, their command of theory, and practical skill. Auditing is available in two ways. First, single pass spectators may choose to audit individual 4-day clinics. Second, full course auditors, who commit to attend the entire 10 clinic series are also able to purchase clinic videos of riding and theory lectures, get first consideration to be a "guest rider" at the clinic (when it is time for the riders to begin teaching), can listen in on rider meetings, get a certificate of completion from Philippe Karl, and may attend any other EDL in the world free of charge (Perth, Australia is looking good this time of year!)

IEO MEMBER ATTENDS “GLOBAL DRESSAGE FORUM – N.A.”

On Jan. 28 & 29, 2013, I attended the first ever Global Dressage Forum in North America held in West Palm Beach, FL. There is a Global Dressage Forum in Europe; however, these two forums are not connected.

Andreas Stano (DressageClinic.com) was the presenter and organizer of this forum. There was a wide range of topics that included U.S. & Canada’s Dressage updates, lectures by Grant Moon 6 time World Champion Farrier, Dr. Juan Samper on the developments in Breeding the Dressage Horse, Dr. Hilary Clayton on Suspensory ligament and ligament soundness issues and how to prevent, and Stefan Stammer on the Bio Mechanics of the Dressage Horse.

The main events included a session of “getting to know” various trainers from the U.S. and Europe, with Andreas Stano sitting down individually with each trainer to discuss his/her theories, philosophies and methods on the training & development of their Dressage Horses and Riders. Then, each of the clinicians demonstrated their methods with training a couple of horses, whether they rode them and/or trained from the ground. After the training session, there was a panel of World re-known judges and Dressage riders, who asked the clinician questions and made comments about their training styles. Each clinician presented a different approach to their training; however, they all emphasized how important it is to work with the basics every day. The clinicians included Steffen Peters, Rudolf Zeilinger, Ingrid Klimke, and Wolfram Wittig. There was also in-hand work by Arthur Kottas and Bo Jena.

The panel members included: Christoph Hess, Stephen Clark, George Williams, Lendon Gray, Sue Blinks, Wim Ernes, Gary Rockwell, Anne Gribbons, Kathy Connelly, Betsy Steiner, Leslie Reid, Jan Ebeling, and Felicitas von Neumann-Cosel.

The forum was very educational and included a wide range of topics. They hope to have this as the First Annual forum. If you can attend next year, I highly recommend it!

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Truth or Fiction - Do you really only get what you pay for?

~ OR ~

Where do I get my Free Lunch?

As a young college grad in the late 1970’s, I traveled all across the United States to teach summer camps as part of the Pony Club Visiting Instructors Program. It was an amazing experience, spending a week in eight different towns throughout the summer, working with young riders and seeing the country for the first time as a vagabond riding teacher. I met wonderful people and taught virtually non-stop; classes on the flat and over fences for the Pony Club members during the days and their parents in the evenings until the sun went down. I loved it and felt energized by the challenge, but I didn’t make much money – they paid me \$100. per week, all the jelly sandwiches I could eat and kept a roof over my head.

At one stop in Wisconsin, I met a parent I will never forget. On day 1, she put me in my place by declaiming that she had low expectations for the camp because, “I know you only get what you pay for,” and it was clear that my meager salary meant that these Pony Club lessons

were next to worthless. She was a serious dressage rider who believed that mercenary instructors dole out exactly \$50. worth of training for a \$50. lesson fee – and not a penny’s worth more. She was intent on purchasing her way up the levels, and now, almost forty years later I still think about her and wonder if she ever achieved the success she sought to buy? The idea that Americans only value what they pay for has troubled me ever since, so I’d like to pose the question, “In the horse world, does more money always equal better quality or is it possible to acquire the occasional free lunch?”

In a culture that celebrates extreme coupon shoppers with their own reality television show, it’s clear that Americans love to get something for nothing. But how often do we devalue an experience if we haven’t paid for it? Here’s why I ask. The IEO is offering a horse management clinic this month which promises 6 hours of interesting and important topics from longeing skills to rider core strengthening exercises and the clinic is free to members and non-members alike. Now don’t be misled into thinking that we aren’t paying for this experience – the club is footing the bill for renting the indoor arena, copying costs for handouts and even the coffee that will keep everyone energized and warm. But notice that the wonderful instructors who are teaching all day are not part of the budget, but have volunteered their time and expertise because they are motivated by caring, not cash, and believe that this type of clinic fills an important need in our horse community.

So is this clinic like unsolicited free advice and only worth what you are paying for it? Or a prime example of that elusive, yet delicious blue plate special that leaves your wallet intact and your tummy full? I’m voting for the latter and hope to see you in the lunch line at Homestead Farm on March 10th! - Susan Moody, IEO President

SCHOOLING SHOW CHANGES FOR 2013

New schooling show classes and awards were discussed at the January IEO Board meeting. A quick synopsis follows, with full details to be printed soon in the IEO 2013 Omnibus.

*New “Western Dressage Association of America” dressage tests were added to our 2013 Schooling Show Omnibus and will be listed as, “Western Dressage Test of Choice”. This USEF affiliate organization currently has 2 levels of tests, the first similar to USDF walk-trot tests, the second similar to USEF training level. These tests can be found on the USEF website.

*New 2013 USEF Rider Tests were also added. Copies of these tests can be found on the USEF website.

*The following items were removed from the 2013 Omnibus: Prix Caprilli test and Series End Awards.

*Late fees were increased to \$15.00 per horse/rider for all entries postmarked after the closing date. We agreed to keep Coggins test results on file for the entire show season. Now riders need only present their evidence of a negative Coggins test once for each mount instead of with every entry.

*In 2013, classes will be divided and pinned in the following divisions: Junior/Young Rider, Adult Amateur, and Open. Junior/Young Riders are individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by Dec. 1st 2012. For example, if there are 6 rides in the Training 1 class and 2 are Junior riders, 2 are Adult Amateurs and 2 are Open, we will pin the highest scoring rider and horse in each division with a blue ribbon and the second highest scoring rider and horse with a red ribbon; 3 blues ribbons, 3 red ribbons instead of placing the class from 1st – 6th place.

*Starting in 2013, the IEO Year End Awards will be determined by averaging the 3 highest scores from that level for that year, instead of averaging all scores for that level.

*In 2013, at each show the High Score Award for each Level (ie: Introductory, Training, etc.) must have 3 horses in the division to be awarded. In addition, the High Score of the Day Award at each show will be given to the highest scoring riders in our 3 divisions: Junior/Young Rider, Adult Amateur and Open and the prize will be a coupon for a free class at an upcoming show.
