IEO PRESIDENT'S EDITORIAL : AUDITING THE "NEW TEST CLINIC" WITH LINDA ZANG, - OR "LEARNING TO RIDE THE PERFECT STRETCHY CIRCLE"

Two girlfriends and I traveled to Morven Park last Sunday to audit the Virginia Dressage Association's "New Test Clinic" given by FEI judge, Linda Zang. It was a busy day, with riders demonstrating the new 2011 Dressage Tests from Intro level up to Fourth. Linda discussed the test requirements and "marked her scoresheet" out loud so that the auditors could understand how judges evaluate the correctness of the movements, the quality of the gaits, and the rider's position. We eavesdropped on each rider's private lesson; one rider was encouraged to "turn her back to the inside of the circle" while she cantered to keep her outside shoulder back over her horse's outside hip, while another was beseeched to, "With love, feeling and passion", flex her horse *gently* to the outside to better supple him. It was inspiring to see Linda's supportive and encouraging corrections to all the riders and remarkable to see how each horse improved under her tutelage. I took 9 pages of notes and thought it might be fun to share with you one of Linda's teaching points that applies to all of us.

One of the most challenging requirements of Training level dressage tests is the Stretchy Circle performed at the rising trot. All too often this movement "tattles" to the judge that our beginning dressage horse is not truly accepting the contact or willing to follow the bit to the ground. We often see riders lengthen their reins, but their mounts decline to lower their necks and search forward with their noses as we wish they would. Or they speed up and fall out of balance onto their forehands (oops!). Lots of prayer is usually involved here and many a rider leaves the arena still perplexed as to why her trusted steed refuses to stretch down when asked.

This movement confirms that the suppling lateral aids are working and that the rider is actively asking with her inside leg at the girth for the horse to seek forward and take contact with the outside rein. This is the foundation of all basic dressage work, and we often hear it simply expressed as "inside leg to outside rein." Linda's approach to riding this basic exercise starts at working, rising trot on a 20-meter circle. While on the circle, maintain your inside rein contact and bend while pushing with your inside leg at the girth to ask your horse to seek forward to the outside rein. Release the outside rein, followed by the release of the inside rein and the horse will follow the bit down and out with his nose. Don't give the inside rein first, don't lean forward and don't spread your hands apart! When it's time to lift your horse's neck back up, shorten your outside rein first while keeping your inside leg firmly at the girth and then collect your inside rein and your horse will reconnect into your outside rein. Try it – I bet you'll like it (and your horse will too!)

THE DRESSAGE FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES CHANGES TO THE MAJOR ANDERS LINDGREN SCHOLARSHIP FOR DRESSAGE INSTRUCTORS

Major Anders Lindgren was an accomplished dressage rider, having won the 1971 Swedish Dressage Championship and ridden on the Swedish Olympic Team in 1972. He also won the Scandinavian Eventing Championship in 1959. Lindgren's contribution to American dressage was large, as he was solidly committed to the education of U.S. dressage instructors. Over a ten-year period, almost 1,000 participating instructors learned from his systematic, structural approach to teaching Dressage at the USDF/Violet Hopkins National Seminars for Dressage Instructors, and then at the National Symposium. Major Lindgren passed away in 2010, at the age of 85.

Since 1996, The Dressage Foundation has offered annual scholarships in Major Lindgren's name, for instructors to train in Europe. However, beginning this year, the Major Anders Lindgren Scholarship has been restructured to offer funding to more instructors, to train in the United States.

Two \$2,000 Scholarships will be awarded each year to dressage instructors to train in a concentrated amount of time of at least one week, away from home. Applicants are not required to be Certified Instructors, but it is suggested that applicants use the scholarship money to train with a Certified Instructor or USDF Instructor Certification Program Faculty Member.

One \$6,000 Scholarship will be awarded each year to a dressage instructor, preferably to those in the USDF Certified pool, Training through Fourth Levels. The scholarship will enable the applicant to train in a longer concentrated time period away from home.

"Major Lindgren's teachings had an immense impact on dressage in the United States, and The Dressage Foundation is very honored to carry on his memory in this special way," said Jenny Johnson, Administrative Director.

Applications are due to The Dressage Foundation by September 30th of each year. A Grant Selection Committee will review each application and determine the recipients, if qualified applications are received.
